*** 5. Advanced Masters Program**

CSE has withdrawn from the Faculty's MEngSc degree. Our only Postgraduate Coursework degree is now the MIT program. The CSE stream in the MEngSc program attracted few students, with most opting for the MIT, so withdrawing from it should have little effect on PGC enrolments. However, we would like to boost PGC enrolments, and Eric Martin is proposing a new Advanced Masters program to complement the MIT (which is currently predominantly a retraining degree).

*** 6. Effects of new BE(Hons) Program**

As reported at the last School Meeting, the Faculty is currently in the process of bundling all of its existing degrees under a single program code (3705). Existing programs will all become streams under the BE(Hons) program. The Stream Rules for the BE(Hons) largely fit in with our existing programs, but there are some new progression rules which may affect how our students advance through their programs.

7. Streams in the BSc(Comp Sci)

The Computer Science program has six specialist streams (such as Databases, Networks and AI). There have been discussions in the past about revising these. Alan Blair wishes to continue that discussion.
