*** 4. 4th-Year Theses**

The Faculty released guidelines for how Thesis A/B might be structured to promote a more uniform treatment of theses across the Faculty. Their proposal roughly accords with current CSE practice, but there are a couple of differences. Helen Paik will present a document proposing how CSE theses might be handled in future.

The Faculty also released policy for handling late submissions and failure of Thesis A/B. The Faculty expects all Schools to adopt this. We will consider how it affects current practice.

*** 5. Core Syllabus and Programs**

Jingling Xue's working group has come up with two competing proposals for how to handle the first three courses in the new core syllabus. John Shepherd will present a view of how the new core syllabus might be embedded in our existing programs, since so far the core syllabus has been considered in isolation. This might also shed some light on how the dilemma of the two proposals might be resolved.
